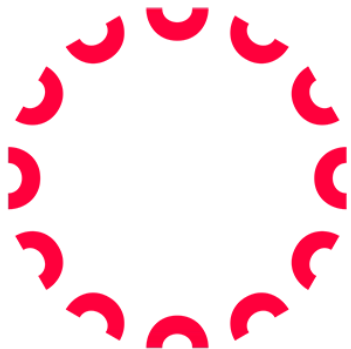

Faculty Support Courses Created (Year 1)

Faculty Support: Flipped Classroom Model

Course Description

This course introduces faculty to the Flipped Classroom Model of pedagogy. Participants learn the pedagogical benefits of exposing students to course content outside of class and engaging students in active, collaborative learning during class sessions. Participants plan lessons, develop assessment tasks, and integrate online tools in order to flip the classroom and facilitate student success.

Course Objectives

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- describe the Flipped Classroom Model and its characteristics,
- plan a lesson using the Flipped Classroom Model,
- create assessment tasks appropriate for the flipped classroom, and
- integrate effective online tools for the flipped classroom.

Faculty Support: Flipped Classroom Model (FCM)
